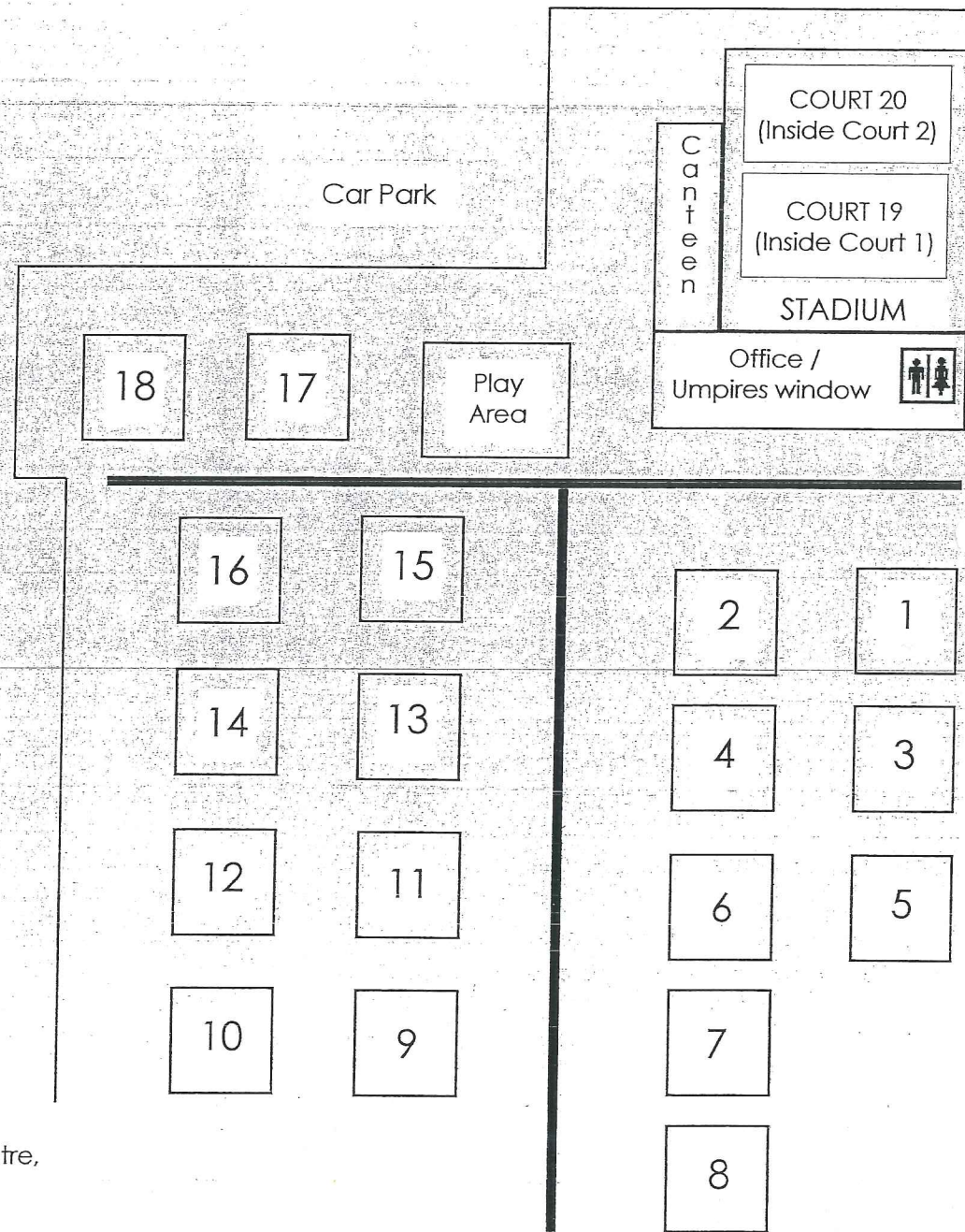

UNIFORM POLICY

Our club uniform is registered with the MDNA, and all players are required to comply by being correctly dressed for all games.

The correct WSNC uniform is:

- * White V neck T-shirt with green collar
- * Valley Green netball skirt
- * Club badge sewn on front panel of skirt
- * Black sports briefs
- * White socks which cover the ankle bone
- * Sports shoes - runners

No jewellery is allowed, and long hair is to be tied back, with no adornments. Fingernails are to be cut short or taped. If ears or other body parts have been recently pierced, they must be taped and a certificate from a medical practitioner or chemist stating same must be presented to the MDNA Saturday convenor as required. An authorisation card will then be issued, which is valid for six weeks only.
