A LETTER FROM THE (EX) PRESIDENT

This is my last opportunity as Club President to say thank you to a few special people, and to let everyone know about the long list of changes and achievements over the last 5 years, of which I'm proud to have been a part. It was only when I started putting a bit of a list together for the AGM that I realised just how much has changed, and how much this club has grown, and as we have so many new members I also wanted to share it with you all. There is a page following this which lists these in detail.

In 2002 the out-going President, Peter Coloretti, urged the members to move to a gradings system as the way forward. The idea wasn't overly popular but did have some support, so the next 2 years were very much a period of change and at times turmoil. At the end of this time, in late 2004, there was a referendum of members held, which narrowly voted in favour of introducing a grading system from 2005.

And so the new committee for 2005 came in with its first major task being to establish a system for grading players. This was to be a unique system which suited our club and was created from scratch. We were unanimous in our philosophy that we would do whatever it took to plan grading games and select teams only after every player had equal opportunity to play in her preferred position, to be challenged on-court to play her best, and to be observed by independent, experienced and knowledgeable netball people.

I believe this is "mission accomplished" as the club has grown from 117 members in 2004 to 186 in 2009 or to put it another way, from 13 teams to 21 teams - an increase of over 60%. More importantly, it has also translated into much greater on-court success for our teams and our fielding of teams in every age group and across every level up to and including A Grade. I believe our members are happy knowing that the club has a consistent and fair policy with team selection, and while we can't make everyone happy all the time we try really hard!!

Growth in itself is not the aim though. As great as it has been for the club, it is only desirable if it can be supported by i) a good strong committee ii) enough coaches liii) enough umpires. This is one of the challenges facing the new committee - to maintain the quality of the club by attracting more people into coaching in particular.

To the "thank you" part though. While there have been fantastic people who have been there for a lot of this journey, there have been 5 people who have been on committee with me since 2005, and the 6 of us have been together through all of these changes. To Sandy Brimelow, Liz Brown, Caroline McCormick, Julie Papa, and Debby Carter - thanks for the support, we made a great team. I enjoyed (most of) the many hours we've spent together, the occasional glasses of wine and even the very rare disagreements at Match committee - a healthy debate is always a good thing and no-one could accuse any of us of not sharing our opinions!

So finally, I wanted to share one more thing with you all, which probably sums up my personal philosophy about what makes a happy club. I recently heard an interview with Robert Craddock, HeraldSun cricket writer. His comments about the Australian Cricket team struck a chord with me as they could just as easily apply to our club if we lose our focus on what's made us strong - he said "We can spend so much time looking for the next big thing that we don't notice the good, steady, reliable players we already have".

I believe this is what has made ours a great club over the last 5 years, our genuine efforts to place all our players in teams and sections where they can enjoy and develop their netball, whether that be in the 1's or the 5's or somewhere in between.

I urge the new and future committees to maintain that commitment to players of all abilities, and to provide for as many players as possible what they want from their netball, be it social or high level competition, to the best of our abilities.



WSNC Achievements, Changes and Innovations 2005 – 2009

- \circ $\,$ Increase in fielded teams from 13 in 2004 to 21 in 2009 an increase of over 60%.
- Fees in 2005 were \$70 (Winter) + \$40 (Spring). Current fees are \$90 + \$45. There has been no increase in Winter fees since 2008 and none for Spring fees since 2006 despite increased costs.
- Very rarely do players leave our club to transfer to other clubs. There are a small number who came to us for a season or two then returned to their original club, and some who left us and then came back. We lose players mostly to private school sport or giving up netball all together.
- Since 2005 we have had 168 new players join our club, of whom 109 are still playing.
