UMPIRES Issues

Its long overdue that we had a feature on umpires - not only our own clubs' but on umpiring in general. We know the vast majority of you are players and their families, with varying degrees of interest in those who officiate your games every week. The best umpires go about their job in an "un-noticed" sort of way, but we know umpires' abilities vary just like players' do. Players though don't have to contend with being questioned, criticized, even verbally abused, on a regular basis, so we asked some of our umpires what they would like to say back, if they were able to......



No 1: DON'T MAKE IT PERSONAL! You can agree or not with our decisions, but you DO NOT have the right to insult the person out there doing her best. Most of these sort of comments come from the sidelines, but think about the impact on court. If you have a young or inexperienced umpire, you will either turn her off umpiring forever (great - no umpires no game!) or you will unsettle her so much she'll do an even worse job than you perceive she's already doing. What will NOT happen ever, is that she/he will suddenly turn into a great umpire because you yelled at them!

No 2: LEARN THE RULES! If you feel you must comment on our decisions then at least be right! Then the difference is in interpretation which most umpires can live with, everyone sees things a little differently. And if you are so sure you can do it better, why aren't you an umpire yourself?

No. 3: ADVANTAGE. Just because you don't hear a call doesn't mean we didn't see it! There are times when the umpire has made a decision but doesn't verbalise it, because at the younger and/or lower levels players do get more easily confused. If we make a decision to just let play continue to the advantage of the team in possession, we're trying to help the players and are not totally incompetent! Also, while it's always frustrating to have the ball brought back when it was further down the court, players ignoring the whistle in the first place is often the cause.

No. 4: WE'RE HUMAN! The day is yet to happen when a player plays the perfect game, so give us umpires a break, we're human and we make mistakes too.

No. 5: WE CAN'T DO ANYTHING ABOUT THE OTHER UMPIRE Sometimes the umpire on the other side of the court is having a bad game, no doubt about it, but we are powerless to do anything about it so don't expect it! Be pro-active and go to the office for assistance, don't just stand there complaining and wanting "someone" to do something.

No. 6: THE 'UGLY PARENT' SPOILS THE GAME FOR EVERYONE As hard as it can be putting up with being constantly criticized, sadly it seems to come with the job. But we wish that the "ugly parents" on the side would realise they can be spoiling the game for the players, and often their own daughters are embarrassed by this behaviour. Either that or they are being turned into "princesses" who expect every decision to go their way! Come on spectators - its meant to be fun!

RULES IT HELPS TO KNOW ...

In the interests of helping you as coaches, players and spectators (and to avoid embarrassing yourselves ©) we've put together a few very basic rules that we all should know but every single week umpires are criticised for and even asked about by players -

ON THE LINE IS IN

In our game on the line is <u>in</u> which includes the transverse and goal circle lines as well as the boundaries. This is the opposite to basketball so please try not to get them confused.

DEFENDERS - DISTANCE FIRST THEN ARMS UP

If you put your arms up before you are the required 3 feet away, you will be obstructing and will be penalised for this. Distance first!

GOALERS - STEPPING IN

If you choose to step in, the defender has no obligation to move away another 3 feet! They can and should hold their position so think carefully before you do this and don't expect a free path to the goal post every time.

APPROACHING THE UMPIRE

Team captains are the <u>only</u> people who can approach an umpire. If you have a query by all means ask, and if the umpire wishes to clarify by speaking with the coach or players they will do so.

UMPIRES AWARDS PROGRAM

About half way through this season we introduced an Awards Programme for our umpires, to reward and acknowledge those whose efforts, dedication, attitude, co-operation, and improvement go beyond just "doing the job". Jo has awarded four so far, to:

KATHERINE LAST who stepped up into the role of Umpire's Convenor for the weekend which is not an easy task. After leaving the already set roster I left for the weekend thinking that there would be no problems, but she was 2 short on the day before finding fill ins. I think Katherine did a great job and I hope you will all agree.





KRISTINE STANCIU is a new umpire this season and has worked hard, to the point where she is now able to umpire on her own without a mentor.

Great Work Kristine keep it up!

TAYLA HAYES for her willingness to step up and help the club. Since Tayla's return to umpiring after her serious knee injury she has been willing to umpire up to 3 games a week if required. Great Work Tayla!
